#5	1628, Sen McCormick <i>(votes 15)</i>	An Act to Limit Payment for Care and Treatment of Residents of State Institutions. As amended sets a reimbursement rate for off-site medical services provided to a resident of a state institution at the level of Medicare.	FY12 - FY13 (\$63,079)
#4	1840, Rep Burns <i>(votes 18)</i>	An Act to Limit MaineCare Reimbursement for Methadone Treatment. As amended limits MaineCare reimbursement for methadone for opiate addiction to 24 months, with prior authorization beyond 24 months.	FY12 - FY13 (\$1,492,428)
#3	1887, Sen McCormick <i>(votes 23)</i>	An Act to Restructure the Department of Health and Human Services. As amended restructures DHHS, eliminates and creates positions, some loss of federal funding and revenues.	FY12 - FY13 (\$284,517)
#2	1884, Committee bill/ <i>(votes - 43)</i>	An Act to Revise the Laws Regarding the Fund for a Healthy Maine. Establishes a separate fund for FHM funds, similar to the Highway Fund.	FY12 - FY13 \$131,028
#1	1888, Sen McCormick <i>(votes - 46)</i>	An Act to Strengthen the State's Ability to Investigate and Prosecute Misuse of Public Benefits. Creates 10 anti-fraud positions, authorizes suspension of payments, criminalizes misuse of public benefits EBT cards and trafficking in benefits, prohibits unauthorized use of public benefits EBT cards.	FY12 - FY13 \$332,654
